One was "a good Norwegian", the second emigrated to America. Both those with and shaped the history of Norway. This is the story of man who went to America. On 7 May 1939 in the city of Fort Dodge in the Midwest is a lofty 90-year-old welcomes 53 members of the Norwegian Students Choir. The singers have veered from the official program they have with Crown Prince Olav and Crown Princess Märtha to greet him. In a short time, without any of the others around him noticing it, closing the old man eyes and think back in time: June 19, 1905 when he escorted a previous generation of Norwegian students singers into the White House and President Roosevelt. The Norwegian singers were sending men to America while Norway's fate was at stake.
