Two More Collections Completed

FOSSUM, ANDREW (1860-1943). PAPERS, 1875-1941. 9 folders and 4 volumes in file case F.

Papers of a teacher, author, Greek scholar, and archeologist.

Fossum was born in Allamakee County, Iowa; attended Luther College (B.A. and M.A.), Johns Hopkins University (Ph.D.), and the American School of Classical Studies, Athens, Greece; taught Greek (also French and Latin) at Drisler School for Boys, St. Olaf College, Park Region Luther College, and Concordia College (Moorhead); was a member of the Norwegian club in Washington, D. C., the Archeological Institute of America, and the American Philological Association; and author of *The Norse Discovery of America* (1918) and of magazine articles including "The Theater at Eretria" (1891, 1897), "The Theater at Sikyon" (1903), and "Hapax Legomena in Plato" (1931).

His correspondents include George O. Berg, Gisle Bothne, Albert E. Egge, O. G. Felland, J. F. Fries, Hjalmar R. Holand, Olaf Huseby, Th. N. Mohn, Anna Mohn (Mrs. Th. N.), Knute Nelson, George A. Torrison, Andrew A. Veblen, and H. T. Ytterboe.

OLSEN, OLAF (1871- ?). PAPERS, 1841, 1890-1951. 2 file cases, including 68 volumes.

Papers of a Norwegian-born machinist and engineer, who emigrated to the United States in 1890. Olsen was a shop machinist in Laredo (Texas), Wilmington (Del.), and Philadelphia; a machinist on English ships and in the American Revenue Cutter Service; and after 1900 an engineer with coastal trade steamship lines, including the Clyde, Mallory, and Morgan. He was a member of Den Norske

Forening i Philadelphia, the Norsemen Ski Club of New York, and the Socialist Party.

The correspondence, consisting largely of letters from friends and relatives in various places, including London, Oslo, Boston, Bellingham (Wash.), Chicago, Philadelphia, San Antonio, and Waco (Texas), deals with such topics as boat personnel relationships, drought, problems in engineering, farm crops, strikes and labor problems, recreation, religion, and sea disasters. In a letter dated September 29, 1890, Olsen describes his journey from Oslo to Laredo via ship and rail. Most of the letters by Olsen are to his wife.

Log-books and notebooks, 1892-1934, contain records of daily events and explanations of engineering problems.
